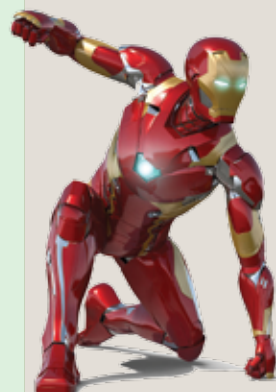

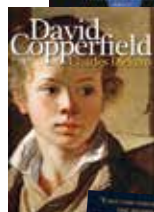
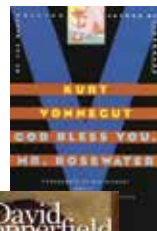

"It's an eye-opener to see what's happening along that production line, and in a lot of cases it's not a pretty picture," Mr. Gerrard said. "The labor practices may be heavy handed, living conditions may be an issue, living wage isn't something that applies in a lot of these countries."

In his books and appearances, Mr. Timmerman does not argue for or against globalization of food, but he personalizes it by observing hope and opportunity (sometimes the lack thereof) that the global food economy gives to the world's poorest producers.

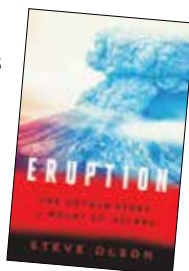

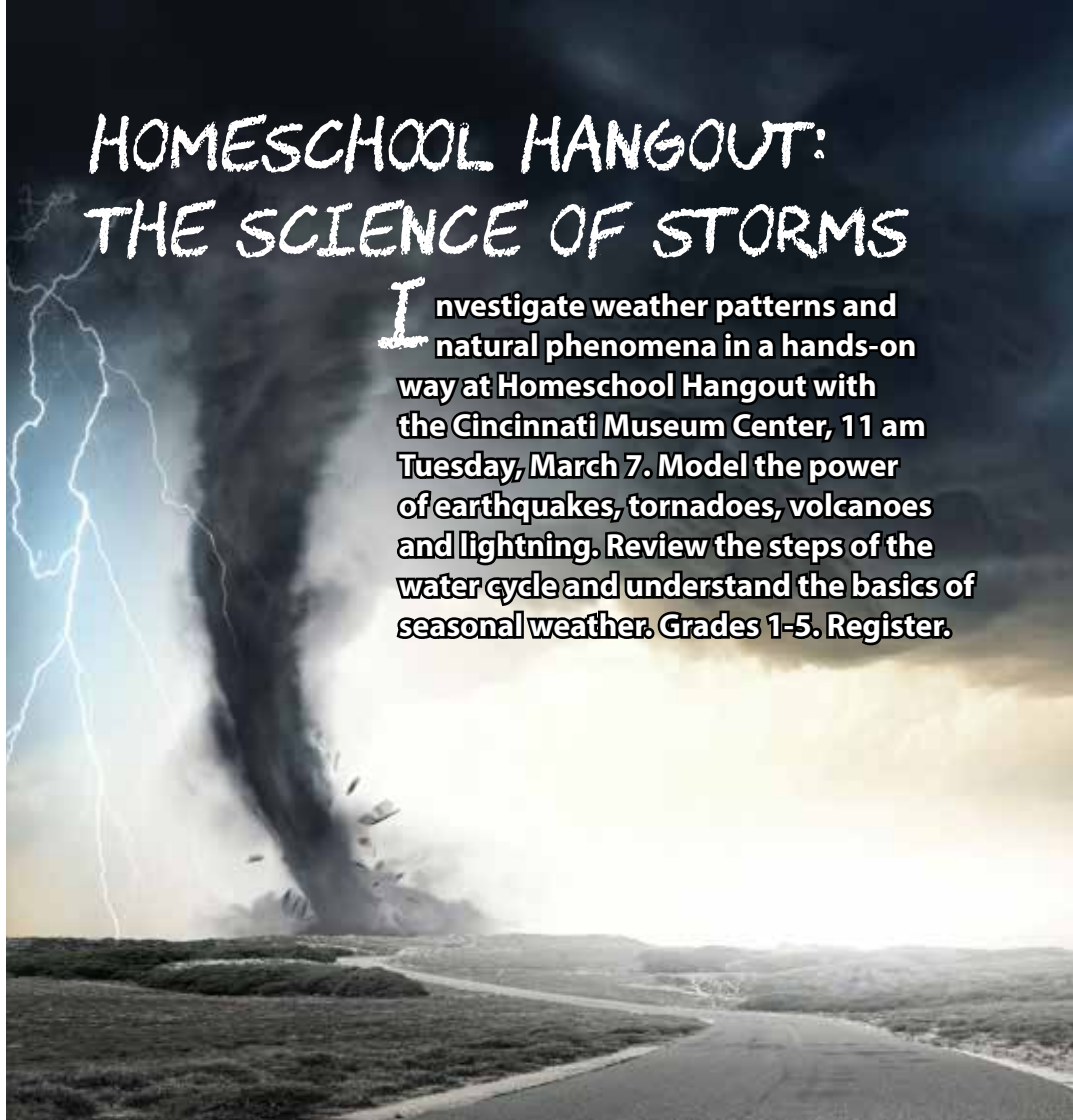

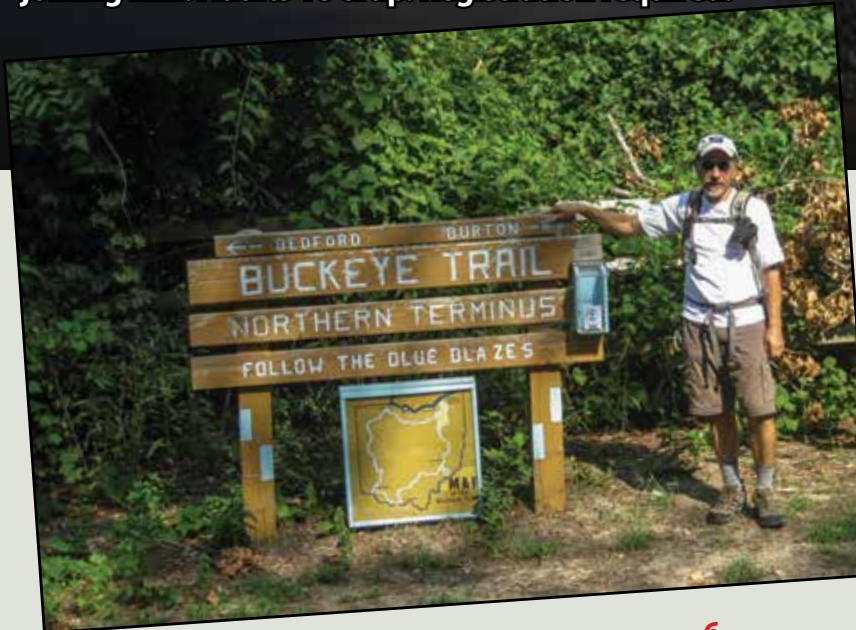
