Fort Thomas native Allyson Coffren found herself in the first category recently.

"We decided last minute that we are going to Spain at the end of July. Of course, I took German in school and don't know any Spanish, and it's such a different language," she said. Mango, which Ms. Coffren utilized with her digital Library card and app, was the perfect teacher.

Mango offers practical conversation skills for more than 70 languages spoken around the world, accessible through a computer or mobile device. Mango Languages includes self-guided courses that go beyond grammar and vocabulary, and includes English classes specifically developed for speakers of other languages.

"It's been really easy to use," Ms. Coffren said. "It starts so simply that even though my mind wants to see the German word, I can visualize the Spanish."

She's using Mango on both the computer and her smart phone. She says audioplay doesn't help with spelling but is good for conversation. "It helps while I'm cleaning the house," she said.



In order to meet the needs of patients in our community, more than 350 volunteer blood donors and 40 platelet donors are needed each day to provide an adequate blood supply. About 37 percent of the adult population in this country is eligible to donate blood, but only 5 percent do.






HIVoices
