Digital Escape Room: Dinosaur Discovery Trial

FAQ Guide

- If you are having a hard time reading images please try using Zoom, hold the keys CTRL, SHIFT, and + together to increase size on screen.
- Puzzle 1
 - Use the alphabet and number key at the top to create a message.
 - \circ You could try opening a new tab in Google to help you find the number.
 - How does the message you need to text and the cryptogram connect?
 - No spaces and us the MMDDYY format.
- Puzzle 2
 - Is the video working? If not, please contact Morgan Lockard at mlockard@cc-pl.org. And use this link instead: https://youtu.be/87E8bQrX4Wg
 - Did you see any numbers in the video?
 - How does the hint about layers connect to the video?
 - Just use numbers, no spaces.
- Puzzle 3
 - Did you open the link in a new tab? (if the link is not working please contact us at mlockard@cc-pl.org)
 - Did you try clicking on anything once the link opened?
 - If you cannot open the first link, try opening the provided hint link in a new tab: https://bit.ly/dinomaphint
 - You may need to use Google or the Dino Directory to learn more about the dinosaurs.
- Puzzle 4
 - Are you using the directional key?
 - What is the order that you have already used?
 - Answer should be all upper case with no spaces.
- Puzzle 5
 - Did you open the link in a new tab? (if link is not working please contact us at mlockard@cc-pl.org)
 - Open the link in a New Tab to play the vortex game, this game may not display well on smartphone screens, but will still work.
 - Polybius Square Cipher: To decipher a message you find the letter that intersects the specified row and column.
 - How does the hint connect to the vortex game? To the order of these dinosaurs?
 - Open the Dino Directory link in a new tab to learn more about these dinosaurs.
 - Are there numbers on the sheet of dinosaurs that you could use?
- Puzzle 6
 - Unscramble the words in the puzzle, check the word bank for help. Only uses dinosaurs that are in the provided word bank.
 - Answer should be all lower-case letters.
- Puzzle 7
 - o Break the dinosaur names down into their root words based on the word bank.

- Only uses roots from the provided word bank.
- Answers should be all lower-case, spaces between each root word meaning. The amount of words needed is given as well.
- Puzzle 8
 - Did you open the link in a new tab? (if link is not working please contact us at mlockard@cc-pl.org)
 - Put the dino group number in just as it is displayed on the completed puzzle with no spaces.
- Puzzle 9
 - Did you open the link in a new tab? (if link is not working please contact us at mlockard@cc-pl.org)
 - \circ $\;$ You were provided hints and clues each time you opened a crate.
 - Based on the information provided on the cards, you should be able to slowly rule out dinosaurs until only one is left.
 - \circ $\;$ How does the hint connect to information that is provided on the index cards?
 - You may need to open Google in a new tab to assist you with getting the final answer.
 - o Just numbers, no spaces. Do not use any punctuation.

- Puzzle 8
 - Caesar Shift ciphers use the alphabet as a key, then you will take the number given and shift up/left on the alphabet from the letter in the scrambled message to find the correct letter.
 - There are cipher decoders on the internet if you would like to open a new tab and look for one using Google.
 - All lower case.
 - Match the deciphered route stops on the map to the correct route name.
- Puzzle 9
 - Do you see a number hidden on the provided image?
 - Hint: How high is this summit's elevation in meters?
- Puzzle 10
 - Follow the provided instructions.
 - Remember that each number from 1 to 16 is used only once. You can use the process of elimination.
 - Just use the number, do not spell it out.
- Puzzle 11
 - Use the maze image to find the correct hole where the meerkat will emerge.
 - Follow each route and write down when they change direction. Which one matches the information provided by the GPS tracking on the tablet.
- Puzzle 12
 - Use the number under each lock to input your answer in the correct order.
 - o Do these symbols represent some of the puzzles that you completed on your trek?
 - Think about your trek, in what order did you complete the puzzles and which puzzle does each symbol match up to?
