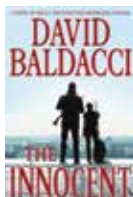

#### *The Firm* by John Grisham

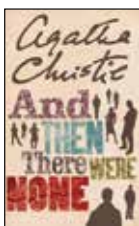
I read this book one summer in college just after final exams. It fit perfectly: interesting enough, light enough, and a good story for someone who was tired of using too much brain.

The ultimate "whodunit." This book is perfect for those who like their murder mysteries "blood-lite."

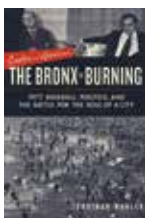

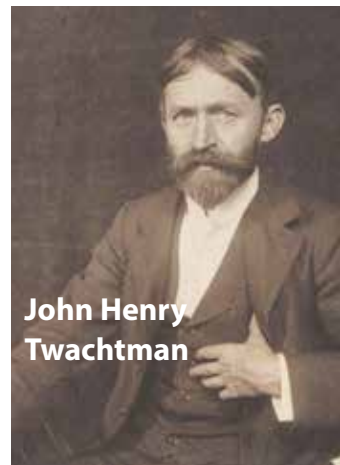

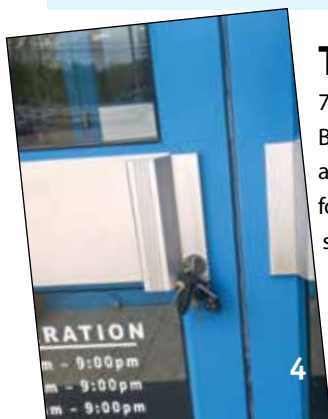


## Teen Summer Lock-In
