The new Alexandria Branch's regular hours will be:

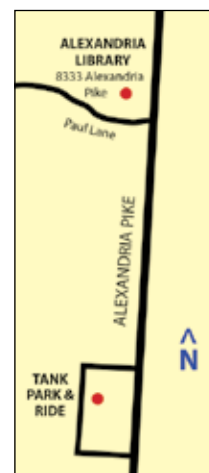
11 am-7 pm Tuesday-Friday

The Library will be open its regular Tuesday hours for the grand opening, with light refreshments along with crafts and entertainment.

Parking is limited at the new branch, but additional parking is available from TANK Park and Ride about 1,000 feet south of the new location on Alexandria Pike.



The Library is leasing the space at 8333 Alexandria Pike, a two-story red brick building just south of Ken's Auto Care next to Paul Lane. It will occupy the entire first floor, a 3,000 square-foot space that is ADA compliant. Renovations began late last summer (see our progress at left).

The Alexandria Branch is at 8333 Alexandria Pike. Additional parking is available at TANK Park and Ride, about 1,000 feet south of the branch.

The new location will provide a small collection to browse (with interlibrary loan available for Mr. Ernst and other patrons), a meeting and conference room, Wi-Fi and some programming.

"Being able to provide a more convenient location to the county's southern population has been an important goal for us," said JC Morgan, Library director. "We are excited to take a step forward and serve patrons in Alexandria and further south. It's been a long time coming."
