

As for the book sale's bargain prices? Cost is 25 cents for paperbacks, 50 cents for hard covers and up to \$2 for select titles.

Some items are free.

Mrs. Maegly was in charge of the book sale for many years and now helps Friends Board Vice President Sue Crouch in the task. "We spend one day a week sorting donated books and then come in extra to purge, because there's no way we can keep them all," Mrs. Maegly said.
"We make donations to Goodwill, schools, nursing homes. Anybody who asks we gladly give them books."

In 2013, Mrs. Maegly and her husband, Friends Board President Gene Maegly, received the Richardson/Conway Outstanding Library Volunteer Award by the Kentucky Public Libraries Association. "He and I were very honored," Mrs. Maegly said.


