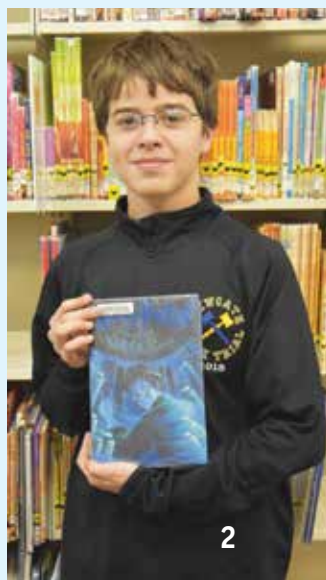

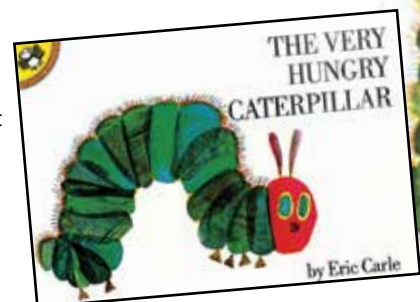

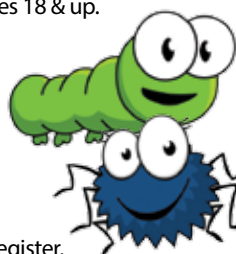

Library Express, continued from cover

Because Sister Bezold's second stroke occurred on the left side, it affected her ability to speak and understand language. Having access to books and, especially, audio CDs weren't just something she wanted, it was crucial to her recovery. "They help me with what I call therapy," she said.

Sister Bezold is still unable to drive because of her condition, so having the Library Express so close to her home at the St. Anne Convent of the Congregation of Divine Providence allows Bob and her fellow sisters to provide her a steady supply of books and CDs without going far out of their way. She currently has a variety of materials — a CD about strokes, a book about religion and one for her house's book club. She taught elementary and Montessori preschool, which she calls "my main love" and still teaches art, using the Library for books on art to share with her young pupils.
