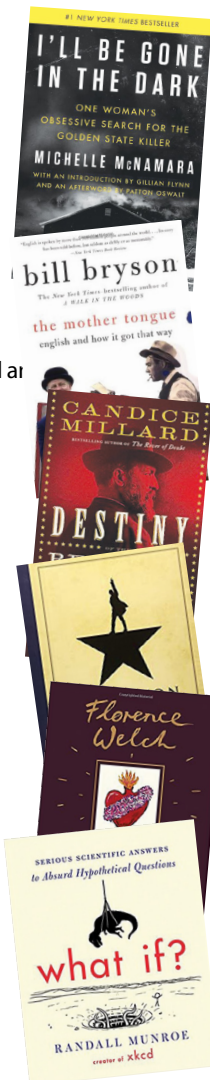

Picture Paths are designed to be interactive and enjoyed by children with their families and friends. This is a fun way to read a picture book such as *Pete the Cat: I Love My White Shoes* by Eric Litwin and illustrated by James Dean. The featured story in August will be *In the Small, Small Pond* by Denise Fleming.

Picture Paths are designed so that when you walk the path in one direction you read the pages of the book and do some

fun activities. For example, a page might suggest hopping like a frog to the next sign, counting the number of flowers on a page, or looking around your surroundings to find something blue. When walking the path in the other direction there will be educational information about nature, such as facts about snakes or trees, along with more fun activity suggestions.

Every Thursday through August, the \$8 daily admittance fee at AJ Jolly Park will be waived so people can enjoy the new Picture Path for free. The other Picture Path at the Newport Dog Park, which is behind the Newport Branch, will be installed when the fencing and construction is complete.

It's a **WRAP!**

All the work to fast-track planned construction while the library was closed due to the pandemic has paid off. The Cold Spring Branch has a new driveway that goes around the entire building, allowing for one-way traffic from the entrance on French Street to the new exit onto St. Michael Dr.

The City of Cold Spring and the neighboring Kingdom Hall of Jehovah's Witnesses gave the library access to the land to be able to have the new entrance and exit and provide additional parking in the back of the building. Other improvements at Cold Spring include an open patio area at the front entrance, curbless sidewalks to improve accessibility, handicapped parking next to the building and picnic table seating. A mural by Tammy Stephens is being painted on the building, thanks to a generous donation from the Friends of the Library.

In addition to the work at Cold Spring, the Carrico/Fort Thomas Branch had its parking

lot repaired and a new seal coat applied. At the Newport Branch, the City of Newport added parking spaces on the east side of the building so existing spaces can be used

for the new Newport Dog Park that is under construction. In addition, that parking lot was repaired, sealed and restriped.

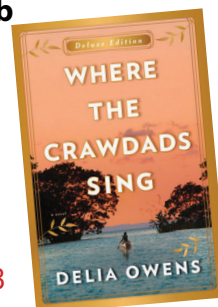

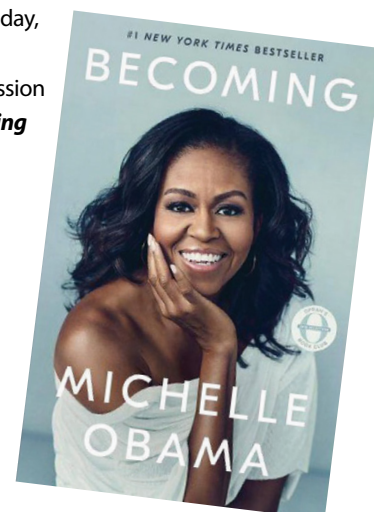

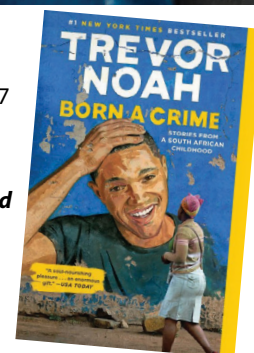
