Food for Thought Returns for Eighth Year, continued from the cover

The series includes six lectures – each accessible live via Zoom and filmed for later viewing by Campbell Media – from Northern Kentucky University professors. Those who attend any given lecture will have a chance at winning a City Barbeque gift card.

Running through June, here's what 2021's Food for Thought lineup has in store. Each program takes place live on Zoom at 6:30 pm.

Dr. Brian Hackett's "Home Archaeology: Finding Treasures Hidden at Home" kicks off the program Jan. 19. Dr. Hackett, head of the public history graduate program, will delve into the history of objects that can be uncovered in ordinary places.

Tune in **Feb. 16** to dispel myths about **"The Ancient Olympics"** with Professor Kathleen Quinn, who will tie this storied history back to modern-day by looking ahead to the Tokyo 2021 Olympics.

Still looking to bust some myths? Come March 16, Dr. Eric Jackson, Black studies and history professor, presents "Myths vs Reality: The History of the Enslavement and the Underground Railroad in Northern Kentucky."

Dr. Jonathan Reynolds heads the series' fourth installment on **April 13**. Honing in on recent debates over immigration and migration within the United States, Canada and much of Europe, his lecture – "American Immigration in World Historical Perspective" – will place this topic into deeper historical context.

How will we tell the history we're currently living? That question is what Dr. Rebecca Bailey's lecture, "A History of Our Time: Recording History While We Live It," will speak to on May 18. After touching on the 1918 influenza epidemic, Bailey will discuss how we might record our responses to the COVID-19 pandemic for future generations.

Rounding out the series on June 22 is Dr. Carol Medlicott's "Beyond the Chair: Looking at Other Notable Contributions from Our Region's Shakers," which will explore the Shakers' innovations in marketing and growth and how such a forward-thinking group faded.


