

Early Literacy Week at the library unfolds Sunday, May 2 - Saturday, May 8.

To celebrate, children who check out items from the library will receive a free book and bookmark to take home, while supplies last.

Early literacy is the natural development of skills through the enjoyment of books. Head over to www.cc-pl.org/early-literacy for daily posts exploring ways in which you can support your child's literacy. Topics range from selecting books to tips for helping your child get the most out of reading time.

End the week that Saturday at our Newport, Cold Spring and Carrico/Fort Thomas branches for a special outdoor story time! Program begins at 10:30 am at all branches. Registration is required.





1,000 Books Before Kindergarten Now on Beanstack!, continued from the cover

The purpose of the 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten program is to start newborns, infants and toddlers on the path to literacy success.

The concept is simple: Read any book to your child and make your way to 1,000. Patrons can now log what they have read via the library's Beanstack app! Or they can use paper logs – just pick one up at any of our branches and fill in a circle for each book read with your child on the reading record.

Participants receive a sticker and a special reading passport after logging the first 100

books. They win stickers and prizes for each subsequent 100-book milestone reached.

Hit 1,000 and come celebrate at the library, receive a certificate, a free book and – hey! – you can even give it a second-go (or as many times as you want).

If the goal sounds lofty, one book per night adds up to 1,095 in just three years. And if your child has a favorite they want to hear again and again, it can be counted multiple times. Books heard at our programs, daycare, preschool or with a friend/family member may also go toward the goal.

Regular Hours Return





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
