Signature Series: Sam Mihara

The new year's first installment of our Signature Series—held 7 pm Feb. 25 at the Carrico/Fort Thomas Branch—features a discussion with Sam Mihara. As a child, Mihara was one of over 100,000 Japanese Americans who were forced out of their homes to live in internment camps during World War II. His presentation will explore the cause for the forced removal of Japanese people from the West Coast, the camp's conditions, how it closed, lessons learned and if it could happen again. Free tickets required. Registration opens two months before the program date.
