Summer Reading has set sail at the library, and it's packed with fun activities and giveaways throughout June and July.

Grab a book and a paddle; an ocean of possibilities awaits this summer. Everyone in the family will find something to enjoy, from crafting sea creature keychains to ocean-themed trivia to submarine science and painting ocean scenes.

Adults, teens and children can track their reading with the Beanstack app. Visit www.cc-pl.org/beanstack to register.
Children and teens can also track their reading by picking up a paper log from their favorite

branch for the chance to win prizes big and small. Books, audiobooks, comics and graphic novels all count toward the reading goal. Read on for what to expect at any age.

Adults

Check out items at any branch and receive an entry for weekly gift card drawings per visit.

Log 30 hours read on Beanstack and receive one entry for the midsummer and grand prizes—a \$50 Dave & Buster's gift card and a \$100 Amazon gift card, respectively.

Toons

Children






