

The Friends of the Library is a nonprofit that advocates for our services, collection, patrons and staff. The Friends help CCPL by volunteering for a number of tasks, from hosting library events to assisting staff with special projects.

If you've visited any of our branches, you've likely noticed their presence in more ways than one. Each branch includes a small Friends area where they sell books and other items. They also host book sales throughout the year at the Newport Branch, which feature titles from an array of genres at incredible prices.

Science in Play2Go is a traveling exhibit from the Louisville-based Kentucky Science Center that aims to help children build lifelong learning skills through the power of dramatic play. The exhibit runs from Saturday, Sept. 3 to Sunday, Nov. 27 at the Cold Spring Branch.

Play2Go is designed with elements of the Kentucky Science Center's permanent exhibit to allow families to experience its creative spirit. No road trip required! Patrons should come ready to have a whole lot of creative fun—all while strengthening science, technology, engineering, art and math (STEAM) skills.

STATIONS INCLUDE:

Blue Blocks: Build anything from a tower to a bridge or even a castle with large blue foam blocks. Children can practice building simple to complex structures while strengthening collaboration and communication skills as they imagine, design and invent an endless variety of shape-inspired structures.

Shapes & Stuff Store: Enjoy a math-rich shopping experience in a store full of "stuff." Shopping for shapes encourages inventiveness and flexibility as children explore everything from shape attributes and pattern recognition to geometric and numerical skill building.

Ball Fall: Use a large Velcro wall and easy to manipulate chutes and tunnels to create pathways, falls and ramps for small colorful rubber balls. This station helps young children explore concepts such as cause and effect, patterns and prediction.

Build-Your-Own Rollercoaster:

Explore physics and engineering principles. Rollercoaster sections of different sizes and shapes can be manipulated in countless designs and configurations. This experience offers opportunities for experimentation and testing.

Light Bright: Make colorful patterns on a giant Light Bright, a childhood favorite that includes colored pegs that light up when inserted into the board. From complex patterns to outlining words and phrases, Light Bright invites planning and predicting skills while designing and developing patterns and shapes.

We'll kick off the exhibit with a celebration on Saturday. Sept. 3. Enjoy a fun-filled day of snacks, music, learning and more. The festivities begin at 10 am with a science-themed dance party featuring tunes from favorites like Sid the Science Kid, Number Blocks and Ada Twist, Scientist. Other events include a Blippi watch party at 11 am. Take a lunch break from noon-1:30 pm and grab some pizza or chicken strips for lunch. Other snacks and drinks will be provided. From 2-4 pm, flex your creativity by playing with LEGOs.


