
STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS: BOOKS WE'RE THANKFUL FOR



Drop Your Drawers, continued from the cover

After a record-breaking year in 2021, Drop Your Drawers returns to all of our branches this November and December.

The initiative aims to meet a crucial need for public schools, and the families they serve, in Campbell County: keeping Family Resource Centers' emergency supplies of clean socks and underwear stocked. Schools hand out 100 or more pairs monthly to children of all ages who need them due to accidents at school or circumstances at home.

This year, the goal is to raise 7,000 new pairs of socks and underwear. Donations of any size may be dropped off at all library branches and must be in their original packaging. Bras and t-shirts are also accepted. Last year, our community smashed the initial goal of 7,000 to raise 15,169 pairs of new socks and underwear. Due to the large volume of donations, we sent a little over 2,000 items to those affected by the devastating tornadoes in western Kentucky in December 2021. Library staff were blown away by Campbell County's outpouring of support. Here's to another successful Drop Your Drawers campaign in 2022!

"Since its launch in 2015, Drop Your Drawers has become a mainstay in our community."

JC Morgan, library director, said, "It addresses an important, but often overlooked, need:

all children should have access to clean underwear and socks that fit."

Keeping such supplies stocked allows centers to redirect funding to provide other valuable resources. Guardians are also often unable to bring fresh underwear and socks to their children during school hours, which means they can miss valuable classroom time.

Year after year, our community has gone above and beyond for Drop Your Drawers. Having launched at CCPL, the campaign has now been held at library systems across the country.


YART: The Yard Art Sale


