



Shaking Up Shakespeare, continued from the cover

The library's series Shaking Up Shakespeare celebrates the iconic playwright's work through classroom-style discussions led by Northern Kentucky University faculty, theatrical performances and screenings of modern movies inspired by the plays.

A collection of Shakespeare's plays, the First Folio was published in 1623, seven years after his death. It's estimated that nearly half of his plays had never previously been in print. Without the First Folio, 18 of the Bard's works might have been lost forever to history.

The series will explore Romeo and Juliet, The Sonnets, The Taming of the Shrew and Macbeth. Patrons can expect one program per month, all of which take place on Wednesdays at 6 pm from January to December. The first 15 to register for each lecture program receive a free copy of No Fear Shakespeare.

Check out the full Shaking Up Shakespeare lineup.

Romeo and Juliet

Jan. 18: Hear a lecture about Shakespeare's tragedy about star-crossed lovers from Dr. Parmita Kapadia, a professor of English at NKU.

Feb. 15: See Louisville-based group Kentucky Shakespeare bring key scenes from *Romeo* and *Juliet* to life in a free performance.

March 29: Kick back and watch a modern film take on the Bard's play

The Sonnets

April 19: Dr. Parmita Kapadia returns with a lecture on *The Sonnets*, just in time for National Poetry Month.

May 17: Enjoy a performance from The Shakespeare Pair, who will recreate select sonnets through lute and soliloquy as Shakespeare's original audiences would have heard it.

June 21: Learn about costume design in Shakespearean productions with NKU's Ronnie Chamberlain, an associate professor of theatre and dance in costume and technology.

The Taming of the Shrew

July 26: NKU's Dr. Emily Detemer-Goebel will provide a lecture and discussion on *The Taming of the Shrew*, a comedy following the courtship between strong-headed Katharina and witty Petruchio.

Aug. 23: Kentucky Shakespeare is back with another live performance.

Sept. 20: Head to the library to enjoy a modern movie adaptation of Shakespeare's beloved play *The Taming of the Shrew*.

Macheth

Oct. 25: Learn about *Macbeth* in a lecture from NKU's Dr. Barclay Green. The tragedy follows general Macbeth, who is told in a prophecy from three witches that he will be King of Scotland.

Nov. 29: Enjoy Kentucky Shakespeare's last performance of the year at the library.

Dec. 20: Close out Shaking Up Shakespeare by watching a movie adaptation of *Macbeth*.
