



Mozart's Starling by Lyanda Lynn Haupt

It is an interesting little book about a starling that Mozart kept as a pet and wrote music for. While writing the book, Haupt obtained her own starling; the narrative switches back and forth between being a brief biopic of Mozart's bird, and Haupt's own reflections of the controversial species.

The Big Read

The library is joining forces with the Ensemble Theatre Cincinnati for the Big Read, a project taking place through June 2023 across the country, with over 60 nonprofits participating. This year's Big Read is centered around Sitting Pretty: The View From My Ordinary Resilient Disabled Body by Rebekah Taussig. On Tuesday, May 16 at 7 pm, the Newport Branch

will facilitate a discussion of Taussig's memoirin-essays. Pick up a copy of *Sitting Pretty* at the Newport or Cold Spring branches or contact Amy Carroll at acarroll@cc-pl.org to reserve it elsewhere. No registration is required.

Taussig is a Kansas City-based writer, teacher and advocate who uses a wheelchair due to paralysis resulting from childhood cancer. Her memoir weaves together stories of her experiences, told with humor, empathy and humanity.

May 12 | Cincinnati Chamber Orchestra

(CCO) will cross the river to transport listeners to the soundscapes of beloved movies. CCO will perform classical music used in major blockbusters, Disney songs and more. Gather the whole family, or your friends, to hear one of the region's most esteemed performing arts organizations.

May 19 | The Kentucky Symphony

Orchestra (KSO) returns to the series, bringing together the sounds of the 1930s, swing music and hip hop. Based in Northern Kentucky, KSO first formed in 1992 with a mission to make classical music attractive, accessible and affordable to surrounding communities.

May 26 Abya Yala, a band that is a part of La Fórmula Music Productions, will perform indigenous music from the Andes. La Fórmula is a multi-generational collective of musicians, arrangers, educators, music conductors, dancers and other artists from six countries around the world.


