
Sign Up for a Library Card!





September marks Kentucky Bourbon Heritage Month, making it the perfect time to celebrate all-things Bluegrass State.

First, raise a glass for the library's Bourbon & Books. Held on Friday, Sept. 8 at 7 pm at Fort Thomas' Mess Hall in Tower Park (801 Cochran Ave.), the program features a panel of bourbon experts from various Northern Kentucky distilleries. After the panel, those age 21 and over can sample bourbon.There will also be a chance to peruse books. And you'll get your own complimentary coaster! Come back to the library a week later on Friday, Sept. 15 at 7 pm for fall's first installment in the library's Signature Series: Kentucky Poet Laureate Silas House. Held at the Carrico/ Fort Thomas Branch, the *New York Times* bestselling author will discuss how he draws inspiration from Kentucky and the American South when writing his novels. The Carrico/ Fort Thomas Branch will close early at 5 pm to set up for the event.

If you're interested but can't make it in the evening, head to the library at 2 pm for an afternoon sneak peek.


Among many other accolades, House received the 2022 Duggins Prize, the most significant award in America for LGBTQ writers. He was also named Appalachian of the Year in 2022, a title he received in a nationwide poll.

His most recent book, *Lark Ascending*, is set in the near future as a young man, Lark, attempts to flee the United States as fires spread across the country, both figuratively and literally. It's a story of survival, community, found family and healing despite harrowing circumstances. If you haven't read *Lark Ascending* yet, you can check it from our collection (along with House's other novels). Roebling Point Books & Coffee will also be available to purchase books onsite.

His other novels include Clay's Quilt, A Parchment of Leaves, The Coal Tattoo, Eli

the Good, and *Same Sun Here*. The library is excited to welcome House, a beloved Kentuckian, writer, advocate and voice, to Campbell County.

From bluegrass to blues to classical and jazz, you can find hundreds of hours of high-quality video instruction alongside play along tracks, sheet music and written materials.



Curbside Trick or Treat

Spooky season will be here before you know it, so get pumped for the library's annual Curbside Trick-or-Treat.
