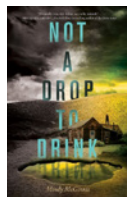

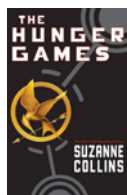

Library Director JC Morgan is Retiring

JC Morgan has served the library as director for 20 years. He announced his retirement earlier this fall. Morgan's last day will be Wednesday, Nov. 22. Following his

retirement from CCPL, Morgan will assume the role of the first state director of Dolly Parton's Imagination Library in Kentucky. Chantelle Phillips, the current assistant director, will take over as interim director.

Highlights of Morgan's career include the growth of the library's Outreach Department; overseeing the construction of the Newport Branch; the addition of three express units; seeing the library through the rapid technology changes of the 2000s, including the introduction of e-books; opening the Alexandria Branch; starting Drop Your Drawers; and helping found the

Campbell County Imagination Library in 2019 via a partnership with local schools.

"One of the first times I addressed the staff as a whole, I told them that I wanted to work in a place that made a difference in the community," says Morgan. "We do that every day. I'm very proud of the staff. Some people have worked here for decades and others are brand new, but one thing they have in common is passion for what they do. It's that passion that drives us."

Get ready to Drop Your Drawers this November and December. For a good cause, of course!

The annual campaign aims to meet a crucial, but often overlooked, need for public schools in Campbell County: keeping Family Resource Centers' emergency supplies of socks and underwear stocked throughout the year.

The library's goal is to raise 7,000 pairs of new socks and underwear this year. All four branches accept donations, which can be any size and must be in their original packaging. Bras and t-shirts are also

accepted. Last year, over 9,000 pairs were raised! Let's keep the heat going for 2023.

The need for socks and underwear is great. Schools hand 100 or more pairs of socks and underwear out to children every month.

Children and teens may need underwear and socks for a variety of reasons, including accidents at school, illness, inability to wash clothes regularly, homelessness or other circumstances

Because parents are often unable to bring fresh underwear and socks to their children during school hours, they can miss crucial learning time in the classroom. Keeping centers' supplies stocked also allows them to redirect funding to other valuable resources. Drop Your Drawers first launched in 2015.

Having started at CCPL, the campaign was also adopted by library systems across the country. Now in its eighth year, the library is proud to see Drop Your Drawers' lasting impact and growth.

The campaign launches Nov. 1 and will run through Dec. 31. Afterward, items will be divided among public elementary, middle and high schools in Campbell County.

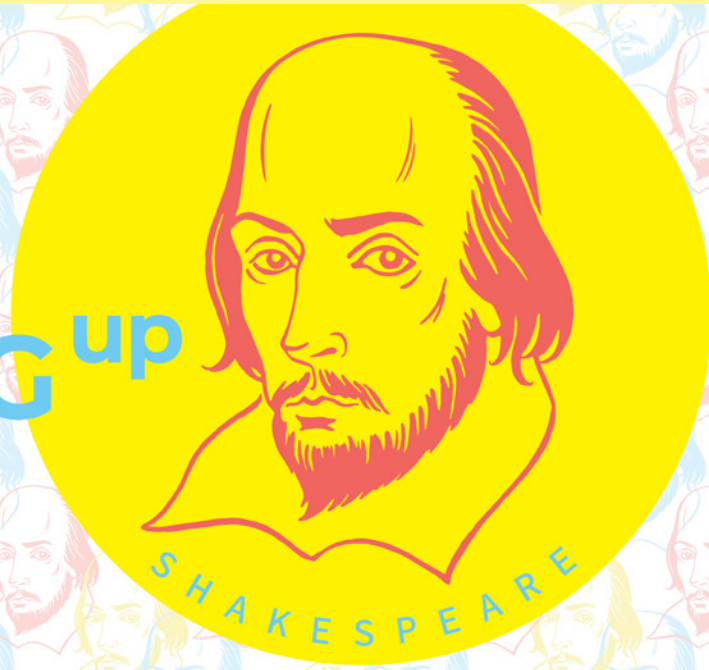

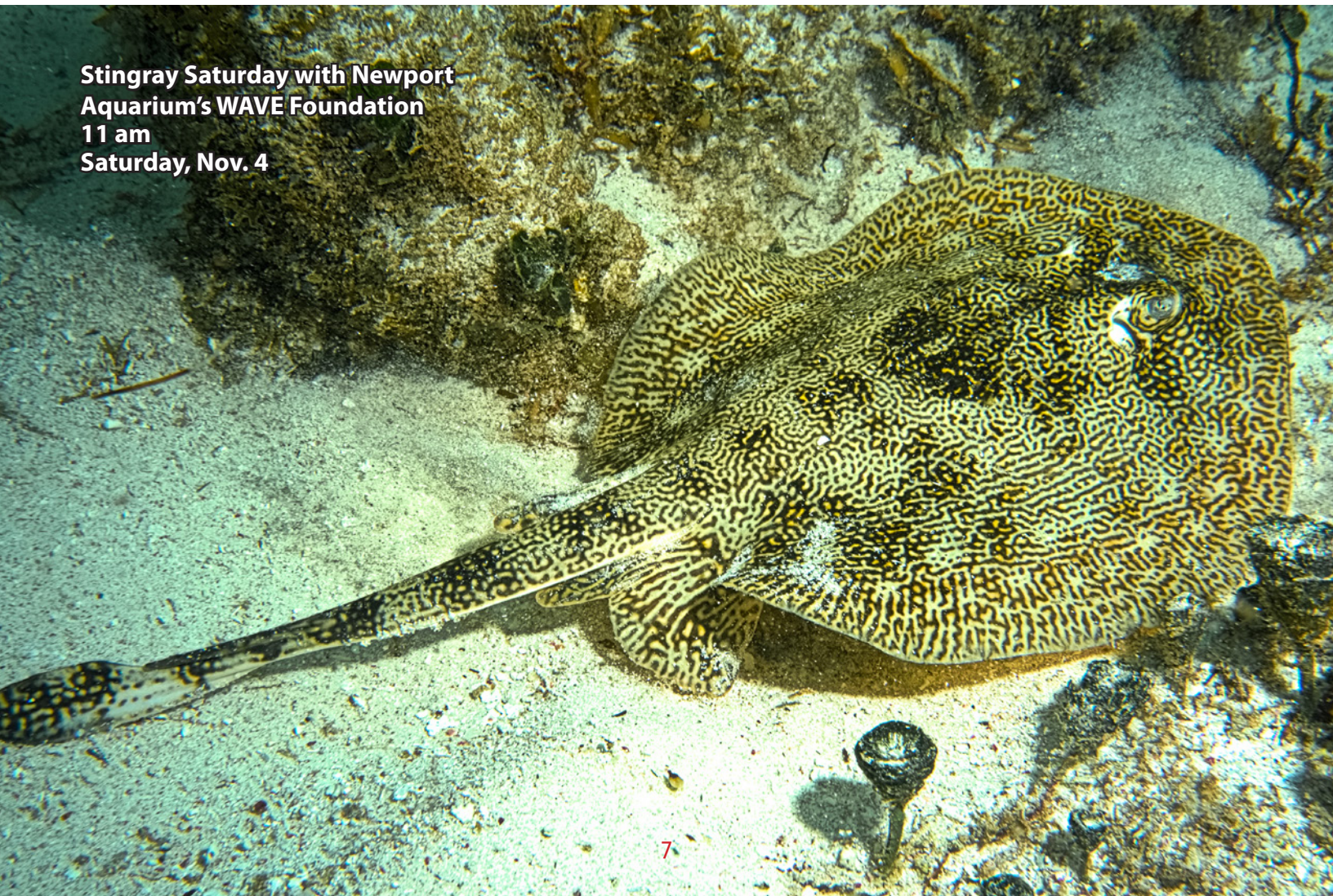
