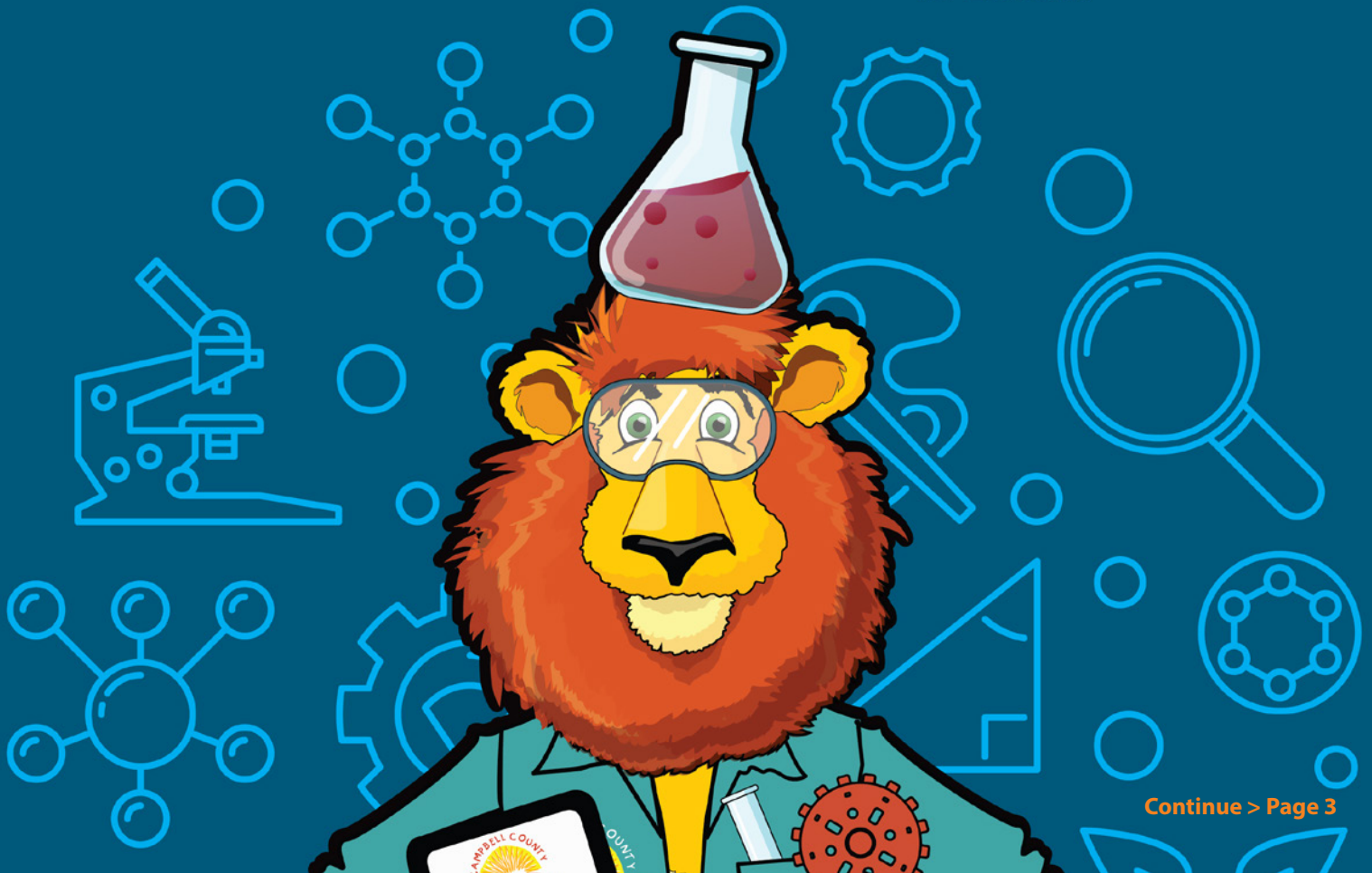

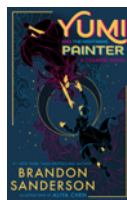
STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS: Our favorite books set in or about the art world/artists



***From the Mixed-Up Files of Mrs. Basil E. Frankweiler* by E. L. Konigsburg**

Two children run away to the Metropolitan Museum of Art. They sleep in an antique bed, get coins out of the fountain and investigate the beautiful donated sculpture by an unknown artist. It is an imaginative and fun read. This book won the Newbery Medal in 1968.

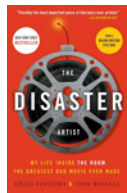

Family STEAM Night

See you at the Carrico/Fort Thomas Branch for Family STEAM Night on Saturday, March 9 from 6-8 pm. This family-friendly annual festival celebrates all-things STEAM with an array of cool local presenters ready to share their knowledge.

This year's attending presenters include the Kentucky Engineering Exposure Network, Taft Museum of Art, Foundation for Ohio River Education, Greater Cincinnati Civic Garden Center and the Cincinnati Observatory.

Creator Challenge

Show off your creativity with duct tape and LEGOs! Creations will be voted on at the Family STEAM Night in two categories: Best Utility and Best Art in four age categories (adult, teen, grades K-5 and young ones).

Creations may be no larger than six-by-six-by-six inches. There are two chances to build your creation at the library. At 4 pm Monday, March 4, head to the Carrico/Fort Thomas Branch for the Creator Competition for Families. All ages can join in on the fun! Want to keep your creation? Come by and pick up your entry at the end of Family STEAM Night or the following day starting at 9 am.

Winners will receive a gift card. We can't wait to see what you make!

STEAM Month Reading Challenge

Who's ready for the STEAM Month Reading Challenge? Is your hand raised? If yes, here's everything you need to know to read STEAM-themed books all month long (and maybe even score a prize for it).

First, sign up for the challenge on Beanstack at cc-pl.org/beanstack. Participants will earn one badge for each book they read in the STEAM categories (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math). Earn up to five badges, each of which gets participants an entry in a drawing for a prize.

Adults, teens and children can all get in on the fun! There will be one prize given per age group. Children can win Picasso Tiles and a \$25 Amazon gift card; teens can win a build-your-own Bluetooth speaker and a \$25 Amazon gift card; and adults can win a \$50 Amazon gift card.

Research, Commence!

The library is the perfect place to dive into a research project. A library card gives you access to dozens of databases—a whole alphabet's worth, to be exact! Examples include Academic Search Complete, Britannica Academic, Campbell County Historical & Genealogical Society, Gale in Context: Opposing Viewpoints, Middle Search Plus and more.

Patrons can also access online resources with a Digital Patron Card, which are available to individuals living in Campbell County and the surrounding area. Digital Patron Cards give patrons instant access to e-books, audiobooks and online resources. Sign up at cc-pl.org/digital-only-cards.

Need some help getting started on your research project? Consider requesting a Book Care Package! Library staff will pull up to 10 books and audio materials on your designated topic and send it to the branch

of your choice. Allow a week's notice to pull the request together. Fill out a form at cc-pl.org/book-care-packages to get started.

Catching a flight at the CVG Airport for spring break? Drop by Concourse B before jetting off!

Our friends over at Kenton County Public Library first partnered with CVG to start the

Technology Training

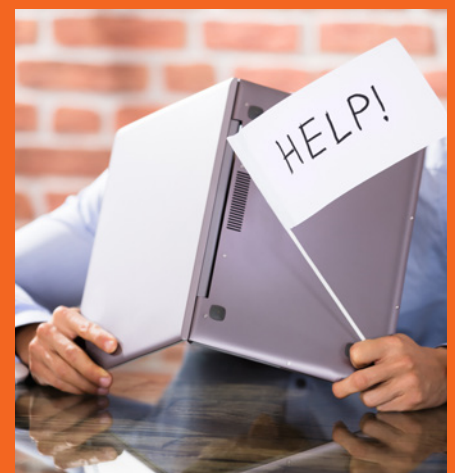
STEAM Month is a great time to brush up on your technology skills. You can receive technology training from library staff without leaving the comfort of your own home.

The at-home training session uses Zoho Assist, a secure remote desktop software.

Home internet access and a phone is required. Topics include the basics of how to use smartphones, tablets, computers, browsing the internet, Microsoft software and more.


If you don't have a mobile device or computer, you can also come to your preferred branch for an in-person session.

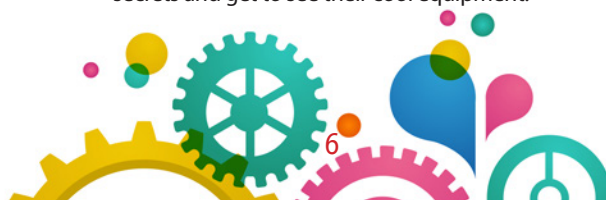
