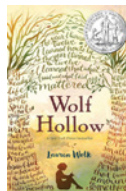
STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS: Favorite Middle Grade Reads



Are You There God? It's Me, Margaret by Judy Blume

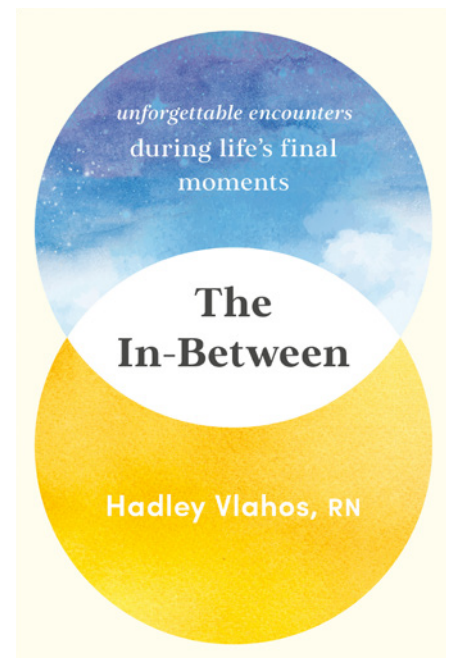
Vlahos has worked as a registered nurse for eight years, six of those being in hospice. Beyond social media, Vlahos released her *New York Times*-bestselling debut memoir last summer. Much like her content, *The In-Between: Unforgettable Encounters During Life's Final Moments* shares stories of her experiences with patients, rendered with empathy and care.

Vlahos lives with her husband and three children outside of New Orleans. In many ways, death has been a part of her life since childhood; her grandparents were licensed embalmers and funeral directors.

She was raised in a strict religious household, where she began questioning her beliefs after the death of a friend in high school. When she got pregnant at age 19, she went into nursing to support herself and son. Eventually, she fell in love with hospice care.

"Vlahos's compassionate, beautifully written book contains profound wisdom. It is for anyone with an open heart who loves a good story and anyone who fears but would like to better understand hospice and the end of life," writes author Katy Butler, *New York Times* bestselling author of *The Art of Dying Well*.

Calling All Writers!

No matter what kind of writer you are, or if you're just getting started, join the Rough Draft Collab. The club meets every other month and is led by local published author CherieDawn Haas.

The club had its inaugural meeting in February, but you can join at any time. The library caught up with Haas to discuss what club-goers can expect, community and CherieDawn's own process.

She has both led and been a part of other writer's workshops; often, she leaves such

events feeling that her cup is filled rather than empty.

"I'm always inspired by the people that I meet," said Haas. "And I feel like they're my peers, even if it's something that I'm leading. I respect my fellow writers showing up because I was in their shoes at one point and still am, in many ways."

Haas has published three books: *Girl on Fire*; *Personified: Poetry, Prose, Short Stories & Words of Advice for Young People*; and, most recently, *Ashes for William*. She's also an online editor for the art division of Streamline Publishing.

Rough Draft Collab is a casual club where participants can discuss both their accomplishments—whether it's finishing a

chapter, writing a first sentence, publishing a book or anything in between—and challenges.

"We can address those challenges in a group where I can bring my experience to the table and try to help anybody as much as I can," said Haas. "I like when people share their challenges because it helps others see that they're not alone, no matter what stage of the writing path they're on."

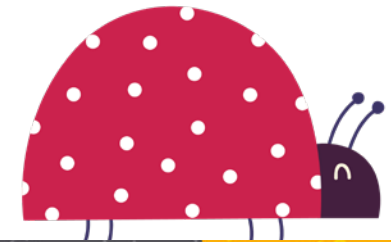
