Letter from Library Director Chantelle Phillps

Summer is here and with it comes the desire to venture out and explore. The library can help you fulfill those desires with books and resources about travel and adventure. In each branch's collection, you will find travel guides like Rick Steves' Europe Through the Back Door, How to Travel the World on \$75 a Day and The Road Trip Book: 1001 Drives of a Lifetime. To find these titles and more, type "travel" into the keyword search of our online catalog, wander into the 900s section of our nonfiction collections (travel books exist in Dewey between 910 and 920) or ask the helpful librarians sitting at one of our desks. You may also take a more leisurely approach to travel and exploration by taking an online class

through Universal Class, a database accessible with your library account. Go to cc-pl.org, select Resources, then click on "U" to be taken to the link for Universal Class. This database provides classes on Timeshare Secrets: Building a Lifetime of Luxury Travel, Spanish Culture 101 and the Secrets of France, even a class on Time Travel Mysteries and Paradoxes. Finally, we have lots of good books that will take you away through stories set in other lands and told through new perspectives. Best of all, you only need to pack your library card.


