There's a quote from Jo Goodwin that says, "A truly great library contains something in it to offend everyone." But what does that mean? Are libraries trying to offend their community members? Of course not! However, the function of a public library is to represent a wide range of views, from the majority to the minority. It's healthy for us all to read things with which we won't necessarily agree, and it's healthy for our communities to hear from all voices, even if it's challenging – or because it's challenging and helps us think more deeply and thoroughly about our own beliefs and opinions.

One way to consider other viewpoints without having to wander the aisles of your favorite library branch is to utilize the Gale in Context: Opposing Viewpoints database, accessible on our website with your library card. Opposing Viewpoints is the premier online resource covering today's hottest social issues, from fast fashion to offshore drilling to vaccines. Additionally, the database is a valuable resource for individuals involved in debate or mock trial clubs, as well as for those assigned to research and write papers on opposing viewpoints. Go to cc-pl.org, then select "Resources," and finally, select "G" in the A to Z list of databases.

In addition, librarians can connect you with the tools to become discerning consumers of media. We all have so much thrown at us every day that it's hard to know what's real and what isn't. How do you keep from getting pulled in by scammers trying to get access to your information and money through social media? How do you know if the stories pushed to you on web browsers are from legitimate sources? Libraries offer classes on topics from Al and Disinformation to Online Safety and Privacy. If you're unsure whether a source or website is trustworthy, please ask us.

Finally, librarians can make referrals to other agencies and resources that help you make informed decisions, from selecting a new car to finding a lawyer. As is also said, "Google can bring you back 100,000 answers. A librarian can bring you back the right one."




NARUTO by Masashi Kishimoto




THE COUNT OF MONTE CRISTO
